About The GNAC

With members in five states and one province in Canada and with a strong presence in or near the largest city of each, the Great Northwest Athletic Conference has established itself as one of the top Division II athletic conferences in the NCAA during its 20-year history.

Founded in July 2001, GNAC teams have had over 100 Division II top-10 national team finishes in 15 of the 17 sports that it sponsors.

While there was no 2020-21 conference basketball season due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Northwest Nazarene was able to play and experienced unprecedented success. The Nighthawks men compiled a 13-5 record and qualified for the NCAA Championships for the first time. The team proceeded to beat top-seeded Colorado Mesa before falling to Colorado Mines in the West Regional final.

In 2019-20, Western Washington's men earned the GNAC's automatic qualifier to the NCAA Championships while Seattle Pacific earned an at-large berth. Alaska Anchorage earned the women's automatic qualifier with Northwest Nazarene and Western Washington receiving at-large berths.

In 2021-22, the GNAC opened the year with national-caliber performances across all of its sports. Simon Fraser women's cross country claimed both the conference and NCAA West Regional titles en route to a 16th-place national meet finish.

The Western Washington volleyball team won its sixth West Regional title and advanced to the national semifinals of the NCAA Championships. Seattle Pacific and Western Washington faced each other for the women's soccer West Regional title, with the Falcons advancing to the national quarterfinals.

Both Seattle Pacific men's soccer and Central Washington football advanced to the opening round of each sport's respective NCAA playoffs.

GNAC teams have won five national titles: Seattle University women's soccer in 2004, Seattle Pacific women's soccer in 2008, Western Washington men's basketball in 2012, Western Washington women's soccer in 2016 and Central Oklahoma women's rowing in 2021.

GNAC Staff

DAVE HAGLUND

Commissioner

A native of the Pacific Northwest, Dave Haglund is in his 11th year as commissioner of the Great Northwest Athletic Conference.

Haglund took over as the second commissioner in GNAC history in January 2012. As the league's chief administrative officer, he oversees all facets of conference operations, including marketing, media relations, scheduling, officiating, finances and championships.

Prior to assuming the GNAC post, Haglund spent 4 1/2 years as commissioner of the Cascade Collegiate Conference. From 1998-2007, Haglund served as associate athletic director while a member of the senior management team at the University of Maryland. Before joining the Maryland staff, Haglund was the sports information director at Fresno State University.



BRIDGET JOHNSON TETTEH

Associate Commissioner

Bridget Johnson Tetteh, a two-time NCAA All-American in track and field at Western Oregon University and former coach at the NCAA Division II and Division III levels, is in her 10th year with the GNAC and was promoted to associate commissioner in July 2015.

Tetteh joined the GNAC staff in August 2012 after spending the previous four years as associate head coach for the Pacific (Ore.) University track and field and cross country programs. From 2006-2008, she was on the coaching staff at Western Oregon.

At the GNAC, Tetteh's primary areas of focus are NCAA compliance and championships administration. She also serves as the conference office Senior Woman Administrator. She became a member of the NCAA Track and Field Rules Committee in summer 2019.

Tetteh competed in track and field at Western Oregon between 2003 and 2006. During her career, she won four GNAC titles (heptathlon in 2005 and 2006, 100 hurdles in 2006 and 4x400 relay in 2005) and twice earned NCAA Division II All-American honors in the heptathlon (2005-06).



BLAKE TIMM

Assistant Commissioner

Blake Timm is in his seventh year as the GNAC's assistant commissioner for communications. In his role, Timm oversees the conference's media and public relations, social media outlets, publications and statistical information.

Timm joined the GNAC in July 2015 after 16 years as sports information director at Pacific University in Forest Grove, Ore., where he oversaw media relations for the Boxers' 24-sport NCAA Division III athletics program.

In 2020, Timm was inducted into the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Hall of Fame. In 2017, Timm was honored by CoSIDA with its Warren Berg Award, presented to individuals who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in the field of athletic communications.

Timm has been on the media relations staff for three NCAA Division I Men's Basketball regional tournaments, one Division I women's regional, the 2002 FIFA Women's World Cup, the 2014 IAAF World Junior Track and Field Championships, 2016 IAAF World Indoor Track and Field Championships, the 2021 MLS Cup and the 2021 Prefontaine Classic.



SUPPORT STAFF

Paxton Ritchey joined the GNAC staff as its media relations assistant this fall. Ritchey is a graduate of Pepperdine University, where he earned national awards writing for the campus newspaper while assisting with digital media in the athletic department. Ritchey is the GNAC's primary media contact for men's & women's soccer, women's basketball, baseball and men's and women's golf.

Stu Gorski is the supervisor of officials for both men's and women's basketball. Prior to taking over as the supervisor, Gorski had a long and illustrious career as a basketball official working numerous NCAA and NAIA postseason events.

Two Sites, 10 Teams, Four Great Days Of Basketball



Saint Martin's Marcus Pavilion hosted the GNAC Basketball Championships in 2015 and 2016. It will be the site for the tournament's semifinals and championship games in addition to two first-round and four quarterfinal games.



Seattle Pacific's Royal Brougham Pavilion was the site of the 2020 GNAC Basketball Championships and will host two first-round games and four quarterfinal matchups.

While the COVID-19 pandemic has caused many negative changes in the sports landscape, basketball fans should be excited about the changes to this year's GNAC Basketball Championships.

Due to imbalances in the the 2021-22 schedules due to COVID postponements and cancellations, the conference opened the postseason tournament to all 10 men's and women's teams. The one-time only expansion will provide for exciting days of action beginning on Wednesday, Mar. 2 and running through Saturday, Mar. 5.

With the expansion, the GNAC Championships will be played this year at two different sites. The majority of the tournament, including all semifinals and championship games, will be played at Marcus Pavilion on the campus of Saint Martin's University. Two first-round games and four quarterfinal games will be played at Royal Brougham Pavilion, on the campus of Seattle Pacific University, on Mar. 2 and 3.

Wednesday will feature four first-round games between the No. 7 through No. 10 seeds in both the men's and women's brackets. The quarterfinals, which will feature the winners of the first-round games and the top six seeds, commence on Thursday.

With the COVID cancellations and the resulting unbalanced schedule, the conference determined its regular season champion and tournament seeding using a points rating system.

The system is an end-of-season calculation that attaches numeric values to each result based on whether the game was at home or on the road and where each opponent's final conference winning percentage fell (i.e., .750 and above, .500 to .749, .250 to .499 and .249 and below). The better an opponent's final winning percentage, the greater the point values for a win or a loss. It is similar to one of the key metrics used by Division II in ranking teams under consideration for NCAA postseason at-large berths in multiple sports, including men's and women's basketball.

WHAT'S ON THE LINE: The winners of the GNAC Basketball Championships will receive the conference's automatic berths to the NCAA Division II Championships. The regional round of the tournament will begin on Friday, Mar. 13 at the home court of the No. 1 seed in the final regional rankings announced on Selection Sunday.

The field of 64 women's teams will be announced via a selection show streamed live on NCAA.com on Sunday, Mar. 6 at 7 p.m. (Pacific). The men's field will be announced on NCAA.com that night at 7:30 p.m.

The first two sets of West Regional rankings had a decidedly GNAC flavor to them. In the latest women's rankings, released Feb. 23, Western Washington and Central Washington sat at No. 1 and No. 2, respectively.

Alaska Anchorage came in at No. 6, Northwest Nazarene was No. 7 and Montana State Billing was No. 9.

In the men's rankings, Saint Martin's sat at No. 5 while Central Washington was ranked No. 6 and Seattle Pacific was at No. 7.

The third and final set of regional rankings before Selection Sunday will be announced on Wednesday, Mar. 2, just prior to the start of the GNAC Championships. The top eight teams in regional rankings on Selection Sunday will be invited to the NCAA Championships.

WHEN LAST WE MET: The 2020 GNAC Championships, held at Royal Brougham Pavilion in Seattle, provided an exciting three days of action and a number of surprises that kept fans on the edge of their seats.

Western Washington emerged as the men's champion but did not take the typical path to the trophy thanks to a pair of scrappy teams from the Last Frontier that shook up the bracket.

No. 5 seed Alaska Anchorage won its way to the championship game thanks a pair of close victories, defeating No. 4 seed Northwest Nazarene in the quarterfinals, 85-76, before stunning No. 1 seed and tournament host Seattle Pacific 86-85 in the semifinals.

No. 6 seed Alaska stormed to a 91-88 victory over No. 3 seed Western Oregon in the quarterfinals thanks to a tournament-record 42-point performance by 2020 GNAC Player of the Year Shadeed Shabazz. The Nanooks were bounced by Western Washington, 76-64.

The Vikings beat Alaska Anchorage in the championship game, 81-78, in an exciting game that wasn't decided until Leif Anderson connected on a four-point play with 31 seconds left.

The women's tournament had a familiar champion in Alaska Anchorage. The Seawolves advanced to their third championship game in four years and won the tournament for the sixth time with an 89-68 victory over No. 3 seed Western Washington.

But like the men's champion, the road for Alaska Anchorage was paved with some challenging opposition. The most notable was No. 6 seed Central Washington, which tied the GNAC single-game record with 18 three-pointers made and outscored UAA 23-16 in the fourth quarter to nearly pull off the upset. The Seawolves relied on Safiyah Yasin's 31 points to take the 79-77 victory.

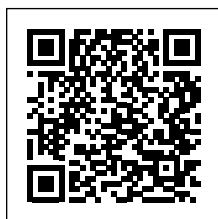
Alaska Anchorage left little to chance in the final against Western Washington, scoring no less than 20 points in each of the four quarters while shooting 58.9 percent from the field for the 89-68 victory. The Vikings shot a solid 51.1 percent for the game, but made nine fewer baskets than the Seawolves in the loss.
