Week of Feb. 25-Mar. 3: Player - Andrea Williams, Humboldt State (OF, 5-5, So., Snohomish, WA) and Dani Deyette, Western Washington (SS, 5-4, So., Olympia, WA). .Williams had 11 hits in 30 bats as the Lumberjacks won seven of eight games, including five of six in the CWU Invitational at Richland. Williams also made two key defensive plays, throwing out runners at the plate in a 1-0 win over Western Oregon and a 5-4 victory against Western Washington. .Deyette became the first player in Western Washington school history to hit two home runs in a single game, accomplishing that feat against the Lumberjacks. Motzny allowed just two hits in 6 1/3 innings in a 8-2 win over Western Oregon. She also blanked Sonoma State on four hits in a pre-tournament game. Overall for the week, she struck out 13 hitters in 13 1/3 innings, extending her string of consecutive innings without allowed an earned run to 33 1/3.

Harbeson had eight hits in 21 at bats and also reached base five times on walks and twice on hit pitches as HSU improved to 21-1 on the season. **Pitcher** – Sara Badgley, Central Washington (5-4, So., Montesano, WA) had arguably the most impressive series of pitching performances in GNAC history. She allowed just three hits in 23 innings and fanned 46 batters, seven different times striking out the side. Pennington drove in 12 runs in four contests and posted a 1.000 slugging percentage to lead the Wolves to road sweeps of Central Washington and Northwest Nazarene. She had seven hits in 12 bats, including a pair of doubles and a home run. . . Sigafos had nine hits in 11 at bats, including five doubles, as the Saints snapped a 16-game losing streak, by splitting doubleheaders with Northwest Nazarene and Central Washington. She also drove in three runs. **Pitcher** – Brienne Dieringer, Western Oregon (5-8, Fr., Battle Ground, WA – LaSalle) won three games and pitched 16 scoreless innings. Dieringer allowed 11 hits and walked just one. She fanned 12 in the three contests, including two complete-game shutouts and a four-inning relief appearance.

Week of Apr. 9-15: Player – Nicole Walker, Western Washington (SS-OF, 5-3, Sr., Kenmore, WA) batted .500 (10 of 20) and scored five runs to lead the Vikings to four wins in six games. Among her hits was a home run. She also stole two bases and handed 15 chances, mostly at shortstop, without an error. **Pitcher** – Jackie Quint, Western Washington (5-5, Sr., Silverdale, WA – Central Kitsap) and Christina Cooke, Western Oregon (5-2, Jr., Tualatin, OR). . . Both Quint and Cooke won two of three decisions. Quint allowed 15 hits in 25 innings and had 30 strikeouts, including a school-record 15 in a 5-3 win over Saint Martin's. Flem, who finished the regular-season tied for the conference home run lead, had five hits in 16 at bats and also drew four walks. **Pitcher** – Jackie Quint, Western Washington (5-5, Sr., Silverdale, WA – Central Kitsap) won three games and allowed just 10 hits and one earned run in 18 innings. She walked six and struck out 27. Quint finished the regular-season with a school-record 18 victories, tying Seattle's Erin Martin for the conference lead.

Week of Jan. 28-Feb. 3: Player – Megan MacIsaac, Seattle University (SS, 5-10, Jr., Santa Barbara, CA – Dos Pueblos) had six hits in 12 at bats, scored three runs and drove in five to lead the Redhawks to a 4-0 record and the tournament title in the Mizuno Best of the West Invitational at Turlock, Calif. MacIsaac reached base 10 times in 16 at bats, also drawing four walks. The Redhawk shortstop was one of three Seattle University players named to the all-tournament team. **Pitcher** – Kelsey Reynolds, Seattle University (5-9, So., Kent, WA – Kentlake) pitched two shutouts at Turlock, allowing just 11 hits in 14 innings. She tied for the team lead with four RBI and also handled 19 chances defensively without an error in leading the Redhawks to a 6-1 record. **Pitcher** – Katie Flear, Western Oregon (6-2, Sr., Salem, OR - McKay) allowed just two runs and six hits in 14 innings pitching the Wolves to wins over Central Washington (2-1) and Seattle University (5-1). Flear walked two and struck out 11 while holding opposing batters to a .118 average in her victories Flear now has wins this season over two nationally ranked teams – No. 6 Humboldt State and No. 18 Seattle University.

In the series, she went seven for 14, including one double. She drove in three runs and stole two bases. . .Holtman had seven hits in 13 at bats, including two doubles, one triple and two home runs, as the Wildcats won three of four games, including a split of a twinbill with nationally eighth-ranked Western Oregon. The two home runs which both came against Western Oregon increased her career total to 31, two short of the GNAC career record. **Pitcher** – Erin Martin, Seattle (5-7, Sr., Valencia, CA) didn't walk a batter and fanned 11 in pitching the Redhawks to two wins over Montana State Billings improving to 8-0 on the season.
