## ABOUT THE SCORING SYSTEMS

From 2001-2016, the all-sports championships were based on a raw points system, with teams receiving points in two-point increments based on their finish that season. From 2017 to present, scoring based on the Dormeyer System, which determines an average score for each school based on its finish in each conference sport and the number of GNAC sports sponsored by each school.

Scores are based on regular season finishes in football, volleyball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's basketball, baseball and softball; and conference meet finishes in men's and women's cross country, men's and women's indoor track and field, men's and women's outdoor track and field and men's and women's golf.
