The mark is the fifth best in the nation and No. 16 in the world. The mark earned Warren her third USTFCCCA Division II Women's Athlete of the Week award.

#PolePosition Northwest Nazarene's Payton Lewis automatically qualified for the NCAA Championships and set a school record in the men's pole with his mark of 17 feet, 4.5 inches at the Boise State Team Challenge.

#LongTrainRunnin' The GNAC notched two NCAA automatic qualifiers in the 5,000 meters. Alaska Anchorage's Dominik Notz punched his ticket in the men's race with a time of 14:03.90 while Saint Martin's Shannon Porter qualified with her time of 16:29.89.

#Fourpeat Alaska Anchorage's Jamie Ashcroft will try to become the first four-time women's indoor champion in GNAC history in the 60 meters. Central Washington's Luke Plummer will try to becom the first four-time men's champion in the triple jump.

MEN'S TRACK Sam Zook, Montana State Billings Junior • Casper, Wyo.

Zook lowered his own MSUB record in the 60 meters at the Mountain State Games, winning the event in a time of 6.85 seconds. The time is second in the GNAC this season (the fastest time in the conference since Dec. 3) and is No. 4 on the GNAC all-time list.

MEN'S FIELD Payton Lewis, Montana State Billings Junior • Nampa, Idaho

The mark is the best in the GNAC this season, No. 2 on the GNAC all-time list and tied for third in Division II this season.

WOMEN'S TRACK Shannon Porter, Saint Martin's Senior • Vancouver, Wash.

Porter earned an automatic qualifier for the NCAA Championships in the 5,000 meters with her performance at the Husky Classic. She finished ninth in her heat with a school record time of 16:29.89, which leads the GNAC and is fourth in Division II this season. The mark also ranks fifth on the GNAC all-time list.

# **Qualifying Procedures**

There are no minimum qualifying standards for athletes for the GNAC Indoor Track & Field Championships. Coaches may enter up to 25 athletes per gender in an unlimited number of events. Institutions may enter one team per gender in relay events.

# **GNAC Indoor Track & Field Chanpionships Preview**

NAMPA, Idaho – A year ago, Alaska Anchorage accomplished an unprecedented sweep of the GNAC indoor track and field titles en route to winning three of the conference's four team track titles.

The Seawolves are poised to repeat as champions, but the repeat is far from guaranteed as the GNAC Indoor Track and Field Championships take place at the Jacksons Track at the Ford Idaho Center.

Alaska Anchorage finished with identical scores of 164 points in 2016 and surged primarily on the heels of its distance runners and the performances of standouts Karolin Anders and Joyce Chelimo. With a number of those distance performers not back, the door is open for other teams to take their shot at the team championships.



MEN

If Alaska Anchorage is to repeat on the men's side, they will need a big assist once again from the distance runners, who accounted for 75 of the Seawolves' 164 points last year.

Senior Dominik Notz is back to do his part. The defending champion in both the 3,000 meters and 5,000 meters is automatically qualified for nationals

in the latter, having run 14:03.95 at the Husky Classic last

weekend. Notz has the GNAC's top time in the 3,000, with his time of 8:11.10 ranking 11th in Division II.

Edwin Kangogo returns from last year's scoring barrage having provisionally qualified in both the 3,000 and 5,000 meters. The Seawolves also have a solid one-two punch in the 400 meters in **Adam Commandeur** and **Liam Lindsay**. Travis Turner finished as the runner-up in last year's heptathlon. He enters this year's meet with the GNAC's second best point total (4,951).

The UAA distance runners will be well challenged, particularly by Western Oregon's **David Ribich**. The junior has automatically qualified for nationals in the mile with a GNAC record time of 4:02.30. He also owns the conference's best time in the 800 meters (1:50.49). His teammate, **Josh Dempsey**, is right behind in the 800 with a best of 1:50.70.

Both Ribich and Webster play a role in the Wolves' GNAC record-holding distance medley relay team. The quartet ran 9:45.45 at January's UW Invitational, a mark that continues to lead Division II.

Simon Fraser is expected to mount a decent run for the team title as well, thanks in part to two returning two-time champions. Joel Webster has won the last two 400-meter indoor titles and has provisionally qualified for nationals with a time of 48.71 seconds, but he trails two teammates in Daniel Kelloway (47.95) and Vladislav Tsygankov (48.15). In addition to his 400-meter prowess, Tsygankov is the two-time defending champ in the long jump and took the GNAC lead at 23 feet, 2.5 inches last weekend.

The Clan will be further bolstered by Carlos Vargas, who is second in the GNAC in the mile (4:11.52), and Sean Miller, who ranks second in the 5,000 meters (14:37.59).

Northwest Nazarene's Payton Lewis is the defending champion in both the pole vault and heptathlon, but will not compete in the multi-event discipline this year. Lewis has automatically qualified for nationals in the pole vault with a mark of 17 feet, 4.5 inches, which is just a half-inch short of the GNAC record. Lewis also has the GNAC top mark in the 60-meter hurdles at 8.36 seconds.

The Crusaders have a total of three vaulters in the conference's top five. including Jared Webster, who sits second at 15 feet, 11 inches. Cole Hoberg sits second in the high jump with a provisional qualifier of 6 feet, 9.75 inches, while Isaac Mitchell is second in the 5,000 meters with a provisional qualifying time of 14:34.93.

Central Washington's Luke Plummer stands to become the first four-time GNAC indoor men's champion in the triple jump. The senior enters the meet with a best of 49 feet, 3 inches, more than three feet better the second place athlete. teammate Zach Whittaker. Kodiak Landis enters the meet for the Wildcats with the GNAC's best marks and provisional qualifiers in both the 60 meters (6.83 seconds) and the heptathlon (5,143 points).

The Wildcats' **Armando Tafoya** enters with the conference's top mark in the weight throw (57-2.25) while Western Washington's Brandon Pless is the leader in the shot put (52-0.5). The Vikings' Gordon Kordas also has a shot to compete in the pole vault with a season best of 15 feet, 9.25 inches, which ranks third in the GNAC.

## WOMEN

The defending champions will ride on the talents of senior Jamie Ash**croft**, who looks to become the first GNAC women's indoor four-time champion. The three-time champ in the 100 meters also hopes to reclaim her title in the 200 meters, which she lost to Seattle Pacific's Jahzelle Ambus last year.

Helping Ashcroft in the title defense is Vanessa Aniteye and Mary Kathleen **Cross**, both provisional qualifiers in the 400 meters, and GNAC cross country champion Caroline Kurgat, who owns a provisional qualifying mark in the 3,000 meters. The Seawolves also own the GNAC's top times this season in both the 4x400-meter relay and the distance medley relay.

Ashcroft is among six returning champions in this year's meet. Simon Fraser sophomore Addy Townsend ran 2:11.54 as a freshman to win the 800 meters and has already surpassed that with a 2:10.57 earlier this month. Townsend paces a Simon Fraser team hoping to dethrone UAA with four GNAC event leaders and 22 NCAA Championships qualifiers.

Other members of the Clan who lead the conference entering the meet include Chantel Desch in the 400 meters, Paige Nock in the mile (an event where the top four are SFU runners) and **Ella Brown** in the triple jump. Simon Fraser is also the defending champion in both relays.

Concordia returns two champions in three events. McKenzie Warren will try to defend her shot put and weight throw titles, but it is the shot put where she will shine. Warren set the Division II record in the event at last week's Husky Classic at 57 feet, 9.75 inches. The mark is fifth in the United States and No. 15 in the world.

Tori Johnson is Concordia's other returning champion, capturing the title as a freshman at 5 feet, 7.25 inches. Johnson already sits behind a NCAA Championships provisional qualifier in Seattle Pacific's Geneva Lehnert, who placed third last year. Christina MacDonald, second to Warren in the weight throw last year, is the favorite to win it this year.

The Falcons are hungry to return to the top of the podium after a one-year absence. Michaella Kahns is SFU's lone returning champion and enters as the top competitor in the pole vault. Kahns provisionally qualified for nationals in the pole vault with a mark of 11 feet, 10.75 inches in Seattle last weekend.

Seattle Pacific's chances are further helped by **Kyra Brannan**, who has the conference's top mark in the long jump (18-6.5), and freshman Lani Taylor, who is among four GNAC provisional qualifiers in the 400 meters. In the distances, Mary Charleson and Sarah Macdonald will provide points in the mile and 3,000 meters. Lehnert leads the GNAC in the high jump with her provisional qualifying mark of 5 feet, 5.75 inches.

Sophomore Mariyah Vongsaveng is Central Washington's returning champion. She came out on top of the closest race in GNAC history when the top-three in last year's 60-meter hurdles were divided by three-thousandths of a second. Vongsaveng has run 8.70 seconds this season, the 19th best time in Division II. HarLee Ortega enters as the GNAC leader in the pentathlon (3,348 points) while Aiyana Homer will be in the mix in both the shot put and weight throw.

Shannon Porter will aim to give Saint Martin's it's first GNAC women's

# **Around The GNAC**

#### **ALASKA ANCHORAGE**



- Alaska Anchorage concluded its indoor regular season by competing in both the Husky Classic and the UW Indoor Open in Seattle.
- Sophomore Danielle McCormick set the UAA school record in the women's 800 meters at the UW Indoor, finsihing second in 2:10.68. The NCAA provisional qualifying mark is second in the GNAC and 11th in Division II this

## season.

- Senior **Dominik Notz** earned an NCAA automatic qualifying mark at the Husky Classic, placing 16th in a Division I heavy men's 5,000 meters in 14:04.38. The performance is fifth in Division II and No. 2 on the GNAC all-time list. Notz also enters the GNAC Championships as the conference leader in the 3,000 meters (8:11.10)
- Senior Jamie Ashcroft was the only UAA individual event winner over the
  weekend, capturing the women's 200 meters at the Husky Classic in a time of
  24.54 seconds. The GNAC record holder in both the 60 meters and 200 meters
  leads the league in in both disciplines. She will try to become the GNAC's first
  women's indoor four-time champion in the 60 meters.
- The Seawolves had improved marks from all four of their NCAA provisionally qualified relay teams. The men's 4x400 relay team won at the Husky Classic in 3:13.45, which is sixth in the GNAC and No. 2 in GNAC history. The men's distance medley relay team was second in 9:55.86, 16th in Division II and No. 8 in GNAC history. The women's 4x400 relay was third in 3:47.22, eighth in Division II and No. 6 in GNAC history while the DMR ran 11:39.24, which is fifth in Division II and No. 8 in GNAC history.
- Alaska Anchorage is the defending GNAC champion on both the men's and women's sides. Both teams scored 164 points in 2016.

# **CENTRAL WASHINGTON**



- Central Washington's final tune-up for the GNAC Indoor Championships was at Dempsey Indoor as the Wildcats competed in the Husky Classic and UW Indoor Open.
- Sophomore **Mariyah Vongsaveng** was the Wildcats' lone event winner in either meet, winning the women's 60-meter hurdles at the UW Indoor Open in 8.70 seconds. That improved her GNAC best time and puts her tied for 19th in

Division II this season. She is the defending GNAC champion.

- Senior Luke Plummer will try to become the first GNAC male indoor four-time champion in the triple jump. Plummer improved his conference best at the Husky Indoor with a leap of 49 feet, 3 inches, which is a NCAA provisional qualifier and tied for 15th in Division II. He also placed third in the event at the UW Indoor Open.
- The Wildcats' top mark in the sprint events came from freshman **Erykah Weems**, who placed fifth in the women's 400 meters at the UW Indoor Open in 57.82 seconds.
- Junior **HarLee Ortega** enters the GNAC Championships with the conference's top mark in the pentathlon, having scored 3,348 points at the Feb. 4 Cougar Indoor.
- Senior McKenna Emmert will contend for the GNAC women's pole vault title.
   She vaulted 12 feet, 5.5 inches at the Feb. 4 Jacksons Open, which leads the GNAC and is ninth in Division II.
- Senior Kodiak Landis enters as the GNAC leader in both the men's 60 meters (6.83) and the heptathlon (5,143 points), having notched both marks in the Wildcats' first meet of the season in December.

## **CONCORDIA**



- Concordia completed its second GNAC indoor regular season at the Husky Classic on Friday and Saturday.
- Senior **McKenzie Warren** not only won the women's shot put, but became the Division II all-time record holder in the event. Her mark of 57 feet, 9.75 inches surpassed the previous record of 57 feet, 7.75 inches set by Ashland's Adriane Blewitt in 2003. The mark not only leads Division

II, but is fourth in all college divisions, fifth in the U.S. and 16th in the world (as of Feb. 15). The effort earned Warren selection as both the GNAC Women's Field Athlete of the Week and the USTFCCCA Division II Women's Athlete of the Week.

- Warren is the defending GNAC champion in both the women's shot put and weight throw. Teammate **Christina MacDonald** is the current GNAC leader in the weight throw with a season best mark of 56 feet, 1 inch.
- Sophomore **Tori Johnson** is the defending GNAC champion in the women's high jump. She currently owns the second best mark in the GNAC with a clearance of 5 feet, 3.75 inches.
- In the women's triple jump, **Rachel Siltman** is second in the GNAC (37-6.75) while **Chase Stephens** is ranked fourth (37-5.75).
- In the men's competition, freshman **Adam Brown** enters with the fourth best time in the 200 meters (22.26) and **James Phillips** ranks fourth in the 60-meter hurdles (8.53) and sits fifth in the long jump (22-9.25). **Ethan Livermore** is eighth in the mile (4:21.92). **Gino Brown** is third in the triple jump (46-0).

## MONTANA STATE BILLINGS



- Montana State Billings finished the regular indoor season by breaking three more school records at the Mountain States Games in Pocatello, Idaho.
- Junior **Sam Zook** lowered his own record in the men's 60 meters, winning with a time of 6.85 seconds to earn GNAC Men's Track Athlete of the Week honors. The mark moves

Zook to No. 4 on the GNAC all-time list. With conversion to 6.87 seconds for altitude, Zook is second in the GNAC and tied for 19th in Division II.

- Junior **Nels Flanagan** also reset his own record in the men's weight throw with his sixth place performance of 54 feet, 5.25 inches. The mark ranks third in the GNAC entering the conference meet.
- The women's 4x400-meter relay team of Jewlz Collins, Josey Smiedala, Janessa Williams and Brenna Beckett set a school with a time of 4:03.25.
- Freshman **Chuck Carr** enters the meet as a provisional qualifier for the GNAC Championships. Carr's mark of 6 feet, 8 inches, is third in the GNAC and ranks 10th on the GNAC all-time list.
- Freshman **Michaela Johnson** owns the conference's sixth fastest time in the women's 60-meter hurdles at 9.17 seconds (converted for altitude).
- The Yellowjackets are the defending champions in the men's distance medley relay. They enter the meet with the fourth fastest time this season at 10:20.90.

## NORTHWEST NAZARENE



- Northwest Nazarene finished the regular season with a pair of school records at the Boise State Team Challenge at the Jacksons Track.
- Junior Payton Lewis set the NNU record in the men's pole vault, placing second with a mark of 17 feet, 4.5 inches. The mark is a NCAA Championships automatic qualifier, ranks No. 2 on the GNAC all-time list and currently is tied for third

in Division II this season.

- Lewis is the defending champion in the pole vault and the heptathlon, but will not complete in the multi-events this year. lewis is also the top GNAC athlete in the men's 60-meter hurdles with a time of 8.36 seconds.
- Senior **Ebu Camara** set the NNU record in the men's 400 meters, placing second with a time of 7.14 seconds. The time is a NCAA Championships provisional qualifier and ranks 24th in Division II.
- Junior **Lexi Tubbs** had the fastest time in the preliminaries women's 60-meter hurdles at 8.88 seconds, but did not compete in the final due to her participation on the NNU women's basketball team. She enters the meet with the third fastest time in the GNAC.
- Senior **Cole Hoberg** placed second in the men's high jump with his clearance of 6 feet, 6.75 inches. He enters the GNAC Championships with the second best mark in the GNAC and tied for 12th in Division II at 6 feet, 9.75 inches.
- Senior **Taylor Deskins** placed third in the women's 60 meters in a time of 7.94 seconds. She ran 7.92 seconds in the prelims. Deskins enters with the sixth best mark in the GNAC at 7.87 seconds.

## **SAINT MARTIN'S**



- A school record performance and a NCAA Championships automatic qualifier highlighted the Saints' performances at the Husky Classic and the UW Indoor Open.
- Senior **Shannon Porter** earned the automatic qualifying mark as she placed 27th in the women's 5,000 meters in a time of 16:29.89. The performance is fourth in Division II

this season and is fifth on the GNAC all-time list. It is also the fastest time in the GNAC this season. Porter leads the GNAC and is sixth in Division II in the 3,000 meters with a time of 9:30.70.

- Senior Mikel Smith placed third in the men's high jump at Sunday's UW Indoor
  with a mark of 6 feet, 8.75 inches. The defending GNAC champion indoors
  and last year's NCAA Division II outdoor champion is currently tied for second
  nationally with a mark of 7 feet, 0.25 inches.
- Senior **Kirby Neale** has a NCAA Championships provisional qualifier in the women's weight throw. She is fourth in the GNAC and 53rd in Division II with her school record mark of 53 feet, 10.5 inches at January's UW Invitational.
- Sophomore **Jackson Hand** enters the GNAC Championships as the leader in the men's 200 meters with a time of 21.94 seconds. He is also sixth in the 60 meters, aloing with senior teammate **Latrelle Swayne**, at 7.06 seconds.
- Senior **David Durden** enters the conference meet with the third best time in the men's 60-meter hurdles in 8.47 seconds.

## SEATTLE PACIFIC



- Seattle Pacific saw top performances from sophomore Geneva Lehnert and senior Kyra Brannan at the Husky Classic and the UW Indoor Open.
- Lehnert was a top-10 finisher in two events, placing sixth in the women's high jump at 5 feet, 5.75 inches, and ninth in the long jump at 17 feet, 8.25 inches. Lehnert is the GNAC

leader in the high jump and the Husky Classic mark is tied for 32nd in Division II.

- Brannan placed fourth in the long jump wih a mark of 18 feet, 6.5 inches. She currently leads the GNAC and is tied for 36th in Division II with her best of 18 feet, 6.5 inches.
- Senior Michaella Kahns is Seattle Pacific's lone returning champion. The 2016 women's pole vault winner went 11 feet, 10.75 inches at the UW Indoor Open, which sits third in the GNAC and tied for 20th in Division II.
- Freshman Lani Taylor hopes to assume the Falcons' mantle as women's 400-meter champion left by Jahzelle Ambus. Taylor hit a NCAA provisional mark at the Husky Classic in 56.79 seconds, which is second in the GNAC and eighth on the GNAC all-time list.
- The Falcons will also look to the distances for critical women's scoring points. Junior **Mary Charleson** is third in the GNAC and 24th in Division II in the 3,000 meters (9:48.85) and is fifth in the GNAC and 24th in Division II in the mile (4:56.37).
- Junior Peyton Harris is the Falcons' top scoring chance in the men's competition. He is currently tied for eighth in the 60-meter hurdles with a time of 8.71 seconds.

## SIMON FRASER



- Simon Fraser added or improved nine NCAA Championships provisional qualifying marks at the Husky Classic and UW Indoor Open.
- Senior **Chantel Desch** improved her top mark in the GNAC in the 400 meters. She finished second at the Husky Classic

in 56.11 seconds, which is tied for 13th in Division II.

- Senior **Vladislav Tsygankov** earned a provisional qualifying mark in the 400 meters at the UW Open, finishing third in a time of 48.15 seconds. He is one of three SFU runners with GNAC top-five performances and provisional qualifiers in the event. Tsygankov is also the defending GNAC champion in the long jump and has the league's top mark at 23 feet, 2.5 inches.
- Junior **Joel Webster** is the two-time defending champion in the men's 400 and is fifth in the GNAC this season with a time of 48.71 seconds. Teammate **Daniel Kelloway** is the current GNAC leader at 47.95 seconds (No. 13 in Division II).
- Both Clan 4x400-meter relay teams posted improvements to their NCAA provisional qualifying marks at the Husky Classic. The men placed second in a time of 3:14.25, the 10th best time in Division II and third fastest in GNAC history. The women placed sixth in 3:49.66, 22nd in Division II and 10th fastest in GNAC history.
- Sophomore **Addy Townsend** is the defending GNAC champion in the women's 800 meters and owns the fastest time in the conference this season at 2:10.37 (No. 8 in Division II). Townsend also owns a provisional qualifying mark in the mile at 4:54.60 (No. 19 in Division II).
- Freshman **Katherine Lucas** will challenge for conference titles in both the women's 60 meters and 200 meters. She owns the GNAC's No. 2 marks in each event at 7.66 seconds for 60 meters tied for No. 24 in Division II) and 24.78 seconds in the 200 meters (tied for No. 20 in Division II).

- Top performances in the 800 meters led Western Oregon's performances at the Husky Classic and UW Indoor Open.
- Junior **David Ribich** provisionally qualified for nationals in the men's 800 meters, running the GNAC's top time to date at 1:50.49. Ribich is automatically qualified for the NCAA Championships in the mile with a time of 4:02.30.
- Junior Suzie Van De Grift provisionally qualified in the women's 800 meters with her time of 2:12.87. The mark is third in the GNAC and 18th in Division II.
- The women's distance medley relay team placed fourth at the Husky Classic in a time of 11:50.03, which is fourth best in the GNAC and No. 15 in Division II.
- Freshman **Alani Troutman** had a pair of top-six finishes in the men's long jump. He placed sixth at the Husky Classic at 22 feet, 9.75 inches and was fifth at the UW Open with a mark of 22 feet, 5.25 inches.
- The men's distance medley relay enters the GNAC Championships with a NCAA automatic qualifier, Division II best and school record of 9:45.45.
- Senior **Kennedy Rufener** enters the meet with the second best time in the GNAC and 30th in Division II in the women's 5,000 meters at 17:24.07.
- Senior Josh Dempsey enters the championships with the second best GNAC mark and 11th best in Division II in the 800 meters at 1:50.70.

# WESTERN WASHINGTON



- Anna Paradee's improvement of her provisional qualifying mark in the women's pole vault led Western Washington's performances at the Husky Classic and UW Indoor Open.
- Paradee finished with a mark of 11 feet, 10.75 inches, at the Husky Classic and then placed eighth at the UW Open at 12 feet, 4.75. The mark is second in the GNAC and 10th

in Division II.

- Junior **Bryan Lee** placed fourth in the men's weight throw at the UW Open with a mark of 55 feet, 5 inches. Lee enters the conference meet second in the wiehg throw with a mark of 55 feet, 11 inches.
- Senior **Brandon Pless** is the GNAC leader in the men's shot put and owns a NCAA provisional qualifying mark of 52 feet, 0.5 inches.
- Senior Gordie Kordas enters the GNAC meet with the the third best mark in the conference in the men's pole vault and has a provisional qualifying mark at 15 feet, 9.25 inches.
- Senior **Andrew Wise** is provisionally qualified in two distances. He has the GNAC's third best time in the 3,000 meters (8:23.18) and the fourth best time in the 5,000 meters (14:39.59).
